Mosquitoes bite in both urban and rural areas¹

Density of a *Culex* species mosquito in the region of Andhra Pradesh, India¹

36 mosquitoes PMH*
in rural regions¹

83 mosquitoes PMH*
in urban regions¹

**per man hours. This is a measure of the density of mosquitoes calculated by dividing the number of mosquitoes collected by the number of man-hours spent in the collection*

THREE cases in British travellers have been reported²

Cases recorded in 2014/15 and included in a 2019 publication highlighting patient experiences of Japanese encephalitis



TWO were significantly paralysed
and remain ventilator-dependent²



ONE suffered cardiac arrest
but made a good recovery²

You may be at risk as soon as you arrive³

39 cases of Japanese encephalitis sorted by duration of travel* (1992-2012)³

43.5% of cases during
trips of <4 weeks³

51.2% of cases during
trips of ≥4 weeks³

**unreported duration of travel for 5.3% of travellers*
